

(1) Hamburg Wheel Test Criteria. The maximum allowable rut depth shall be 0.5 in. (12.5 mm). The minimum number of wheel passes at the 0.5 in. (12.5 mm) rut depth criteria shall be based on the high temperature binder grade of the mix as specified in the mix requirements table of the plans.

- 1/ When produced at temperatures of 275 ± 5 °F (135 ± 3 °C) or less, loose Warm Mix Asphalt shall be oven aged at 270 ± 5 °F (132 ± 3 °C) for two hours prior to gyratory compaction of Hamburg Wheel specimens.
- (2) Tensile Strength Criteria. The minimum allowable conditioned tensile strength shall be 415 kPa (60 psi) for non-polymer modified performance graded (PG) asphalt binder and 550 kPa (80 psi) for polymer modified PG asphalt binder. The maximum allowable unconditioned tensile strength shall be 1380 kPa (200 psi)."

<u>Production Testing</u>. Revise Article 1030.06(a) of the Standard Specifications to read:

"(a) High ESAL, IL-4.75 and SMA Mixtures. For each contract, 300 ton (275 metric tons) test strip will be required at the beginning of HMA production for each mixture with a quantity of 3000 tons (2750 metric tons) or more according to the Manual of Test Procedures for Materials "Hot Mix Asphalt Test Strip Procedures".

Before start-up, target values shall be determined by applying gradation correction factors to the JMF when applicable. These correction factors shall be determined from previous experience. The target values, who approved by the Engineer, shall be used to control HMA production. Plant settings no control charts shall be set according to target values.

Before constructing the test strip target values shall be determined by applying gradation correction factors to the IMF when applicable. After any JMF adjustment, the JMF shall become the A justed Job Mix Formula (AJMF). Upon completion of the first acceptable test strip, the SMF shall become the AJMF regardless of whether or not the JMF has been adjusted. In an adjustment/plant change is made, the Engineer may require a new test strip to be constructed. If the HMA placed during the initial test strip is determined to be unacceptable to remain in place by the Engineer, it shall be removed and replaced.

Any adjustments outside the above limitations will require a new mix design.

Mixture sampled to represent the test strip shall include additional material sufficient for the Department to conduct Hamburg Wheel testing according to Illinois Modified AASHTO T324 (approximately 60 lb (27 kg) total).

The Contractor shall immediately cease production upon notification by the Engineer of failing Hamburg Wheel test. All prior produced material may be paved out provided all other mixture criteria is being met. No additional mixture shall be produced until the Engineer receives passing Hamburg Wheel tests.

The Department may conduct additional Hamburg Wheel test on poduction material as determined by the Engineer."

Revise the title of Article 1030.06(b) of the Standard Specifications to each

"(b) Low ESAL and All Other Mixtures."

System for Hydrated Lime Addition. Revise the four a sentence of the third paragraph of Article 1030.04(c) of the Standard Specifications to it at:

"The method of application shall be according to article 1102.01(a)(10)."

Replace the first three sentences of the second paragraph of Article 1102.01(a)(10) of the Standard Specifications to read:

"When hydrated lime is used as the anti-strip additive, a separate bin or tank and feeder system shall be provided to store and accurately proportion the lime onto the aggregate either as a slurry, as dry lime applied to damp aggregates, or as dry lime injected onto the hot aggregates prior to adding the liquid asphalt cement. If the hydrated lime is added either as a slurry or as dry lime or damp aggregates, the lime and aggregates shall be mixed by a power driven as milk a provide a uniform coating of the lime prior to entering the dryer. If dry hydrated lime is added to the hot dry aggregates in a dryer-drum plant, the lime shall be added in such a manner that the lime will not become entrained into the air stream of the dryer-drum and that thorough dry mixing shall occur prior to the injection point of the liquid asphalt. When a batch plant is used, the hydrated lime shall be added to the mixture in the weigh hopper or as approved by the Engineer."

<u>Basis of Payment</u>. Replace the seventh paragraph of Article 406.14 of the Standard Specifications with the following:

"For mixes designed and verified under the Hamburg Wheel criteria, the cost of furnishing and introducing anti-stripping additives in the HMA will not be paid for separately, but shall be considered as included in the contract unit price of the HMA item involved.

If an anti-stripping additive is required for any other HMA mix, the cost of the additive will be paid for according to Article 109.04. The cost incurred in introducing the additive into the HMA will not be paid for separately, but shall be considered as included in the contract unit price of the HMA item involved.

No additional compensation will be awarded to the Contractor because of reduced production rates associated with the addition of the anti-stripping additive."

REMOVAL AND DISPOSAL OF REGULATED SUBSTANCES (BDE)

Effective: January 1, 2012 Revised: November 2, 2012

Revise Article 669.01 of the Standard Specifications to read

"669.01 Description. This work shall consist of transportation and proper disposal of contaminated soil and water. This work shall also consist of the removal, transportation, and proper disposal of underground storage tanks (UST) after content and associated underground piping to the point where the piping is above the ground including determining the content types and estimated quantities."

Revise Article 669.08 of the Standard specifications to read:

"669.08 Contaminated Soil and/or Grundwater Monitoring. The Contractor shall hire a qualified environmental firm to monitor the area containing the regulated substances. The affected area shall be monitored with a photoionization detector (PID) utilizing a lamp of 10.6eV or greater or a flame ionization detector (FID). Any field screen reading on the PID or FID in excess of background levels indicates the potential presence of contaminated material requiring handling as a non-special race, special waste, or hazardous waste. No excavated soils can be taken to a clear construction and demolition debris (CCDD) facility or an uncontaminated soil fill operation with detectable PID or FID meter readings that are above background. The PID or FID meter shall be calibrated on-site and background level readings taken and recorded daily. All testing shall be done by a qualified engineer/technician. Such testing and monitoring shall be included in the work. The Contractor shall identify the exact limits of removal of non-special waste, special waste, or hazardous waste. All limits shall be approved by the Engineer prior to excavation. The Contractor shall take all necessary precautions.

Based upon the land use history of the subject property and/or PID or FID readings indicating contamination, a soil or groundwater sample shall be taken from the same location and submitted to an approved laboratory. Soil or groundwater samples shall be analyzed for the contaminants of concern, including pH, based on the property's land use history or the parameters listed in the maximum allowable concentration (MAC) for chemical constituents in uncontaminated soil established pursuant to Subpart F of 35 Illinois Administrative Code 1100.605. The analytical results shall serve to document the level of soil contamination. Soil and groundwater samples may be required at the discretion of the Engineer to verify the level of soil and groundwater contamination.

Samples shall be grab samples (not combined with other locations). The samples shall be taken with decontaminated or disposable instruments. The samples shall be placed in sealed containers and transported in an insulated container to the laboratory. The container shall maintain a temperature of 39 °F (4 °C). All samples shall be clearly labeled. The labels shall indicate the sample number, date sampled, location and elevation, and any other observations.

The laboratory shall use analytical methods which are able to meet the lowest appropriate practical quantitation limits (PQL) or estimated quantitation limit (EQL) specified in "Test Methods for Evaluating Solid Wastes, Physical/Chemical Methods (EPA hublication No. SW-846 and "Methods for the Determination of Organic Compounds in Drinking Water", EPA, EMSL, EPA-600/4-88/039. For parameters where the specifical cleanup objective is below the acceptable detection limit (ADL), the ADL shall serve at the change objective. For other parameters the ADL shall be equal to or below the specified change objective."

Replace the first two paragraphs of Article 669.79 of the Standard Specifications with the following:

"669.09 Contaminated Soil and/or Goundwater Management and Disposal. The management and disposal of contaminated sil and/or groundwater shall be according to the following:

- (a) Soil Analytical Results Fixeed Most Stringent MAC. When the soil analytical results indicate that detected evels exceed the most stringent maximum allowable concentration (MAC) for demical constituents in uncontaminated soil established pursuant to Subrart F of 35 Illinois Administrative Code 1100.605, the soil shall be managed as follows:
 - (1) When condition results indicate inorganic chemical constituents exceed the most stringent MAC but they are still considered within area background levels by the Engineer, the excavated soil can be utilized within the construction limits as fill, when suitable. Such soil excavated for storm sewers can be placed back into the excavated trench as backfill, when suitable, unless trench backfill is specified. If the soils cannot be utilized within the construction limits, they shall be managed and disposed of off-site as a non-special waste, special waste, or hazardous waste as applicable.
 - (2) When analytical results indicate chemical constituents exceed the most stringent MAC but do not exceed the MAC for a Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA) County, the excavated soil can be utilized within the construction limits as fill, when suitable, or managed and disposed of off-site as "uncontaminated soil" at a CCDD facility or an uncontaminated soil fill operation within an MSA County provided the pH of the soil is within the range of 6.25 9.0, inclusive.
 - (3) When analytical results indicate chemical constituents exceed the most stringent MAC but do not exceed the MAC for an MSA County excluding Chicago, or the MAC within the Chicago corporate limits, the excavated soil can be utilized within the construction limits as fill, when suitable, or managed and disposed of off-site as "uncontaminated soil" at a CCDD facility or an uncontaminated soil fill operation within an MSA County excluding Chicago or within the Chicago corporate limits provided the pH of the soil is within the range of 6.25 9.0, inclusive.

- (4) When analytical results indicate chemical constituents exceed the most stringent MAC but do not exceed the MAC for an MSA County excluding Chicago, the excavated soil can be utilized within the construction limits as fil, when suitable, or managed and disposed of off-site as "uncontaminated oil at CCDD facility or an uncontaminated soil fill operation within an MSA County excluding Chicago provided the pH of the soil is within the range of 6.25 9.6 singlast e.
- (5) When the Engineer determines soil sannot be managed according to Articles 669.09(a)(1) through (a)(4) above, the soil shall be managed and disposed of off-site as a non-special waste, special state, or hazardous waste as applicable.
- (b) Soil Analytical Results Do Not Exceld Mos Stringent MAC. When the soil analytical results indicate that detected levels do not exceed the most stringent MAC but the pH of the soil is less than 6.25 or greater than 9.0, the excavated soil can be utilized within the construction limits or managed and disposed of off-site as "uncontaminated soil" according to Article 202.63. However the excavated soil cannot be taken to a CCDD facility or an uncontaminated soil fill operation.
- (c) Groundwater. When groundwater analytical results indicate the detected levels are above Appendix 8, Tabl. E of 35 Illinois Administrative Code 742, the most stringent Tier 1 Groundwater Lemediation Objectives for Groundwater Component of the Groundwater Industrian Route for Class 1 groundwater, the groundwater shall be managed oil site as a special waste.

All groundwater encountered within lateral trenches may be managed within the trench and allowed to infiltrate back into the ground. If the groundwater cannot be managed within the trench it must be removed as a special or hazardous waste. The Contractor is prohibited from managing groundwater within the trench by discharging it through any existing or new storm sewer. The Contractor shall install backfill plugs within the area of groundwater contamination.

One backfill plug shall be placed down gradient to the area of groundwater contamination. Backfill plugs shall be installed at intervals not to exceed 50 ft (15 m). Backfill plugs are to be 4 ft (1.2 m) long, measured parallel to the trench, full trench width and depth. Backfill plugs shall not have any fine aggregate bedding or backfill, but shall be entirely cohesive soil or any class of concrete. The Contractor shall provide test data that the material has a permeability of less than 10⁻⁷ cm/sec according to ASTM D 5084, Method A or per another test method approved by the Engineer."

Revise Article 669.14 of the Standard Specifications to read:

"669.14 Final Environmental Construction Report. At the end of the project, the Contractor will prepare and submit three copies of the Environmental Construction Report on the activities conducted during the life of the project, one copy shall be submitted to the Resident Engineer, one copy shall be submitted to the District's Environmental Studies Unit, and one copy shall be submitted with an electronic copy in Adode.pdf format to the Geologic

and Waste Assessment Unit, Bureau of Design and Environment, IDOT, 2300 South Dirksen Parkway, Springfield, Illinois 62764. The technical report shall include all pertinent information regarding the project including, but not limited to:

- (a) Measures taken to identify, monitor, handle, and all post of soil or groundwater containing regulated substances, to prevent further micration of regulated substances, and to protect workers.
- (b) Cost of identifying, monitoring, handling, and disclosing of soil or groundwater containing regulated substances, the cost of preventing further migration of regulated substances, and the cost for worker protection from the egulated substances. All cost should be in the format of the contract pay items listed in the contract plans (identified by the preliminary environmental site in estigation (ESA) site number),
- (c) Plan sheets showing the areas containing the regulated substances,
- (d) Field sampling and testing results used to identify the nature and extent of the regulated substances.
- (e) Waste manifests (identified by the preliminary environmental site investigation (PESA) site number) for special or hazardous waste disposal, and
- (f) Landfill tickes (identified by the preliminary environmental site investigation (PESA) site number) for not special waste disposal."

Revise the second paragraph of Article 669.16 of the Standard Specifications to read:

"The transportation and disposal of soil and other materials from an excavation determined to be contaminated will be paid for at the contract unit price per cubic yard (cubic meter) for NON-SPECIAL WASTE DISPOSAL, SPECIAL WASTE DISPOSAL, or HAZARDOUS WASTE DISPOSAL."

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REMOVAL AND DISPOSAL OF SURPLUS MATERIALS (BDE)

Effective: November 2, 2012

Revise the first four paragraphs of Article 202.03 of the Stand at Specifications to read:

"202.03 Removal and Disposal of Surplus, Unstable, Insuitable, and Organic Materials. Suitable excavated materials shall not be wasted without permission of the Engineer. The Contractor shall dispose of all surplus, unstable, unsuitable, and organic materials, in such a manner that public or private property will not be damaged or endangered.

Suitable earth, stones and boulders naturally occurring within the right-of-way may be placed in fills or embankments in lifts and sompacted according to Section 205. Broken concrete without protruding metal bars brights, rock, stone, reclaimed asphalt pavement with no expansive aggregate, or uncontaminated dirt and sand generated from construction or demolition activities may be used in embankment or in fill. If used in fills or embankments, these materials shall be placed and compacted to the satisfaction of the Engineer; shall be buried under a minimum of 2 ft (600 cm) of earth cover (except when the materials include only uncontaminated dirt); an shall not create an unsightly appearance or detract from the natural topographic features of an area. Broken concrete without protruding metal bars, bricks, rock, or stone may be used as riph as approved by the Engineer. If the materials are used for fill in locations within the right of-way but outside project construction limits, the Contractor must specify to the Engineer, in writing, how the landscape restoration of the fill areas will be accomplished. Placement of fill in such areas shall not commence until the Contractor's landscape restoration plan is approved by the Engineer.

Aside from the materials listed above, all other construction and demolition debris or waste shall be disposed of in a licensed landfill, recycled, reused, or otherwise disposed of as allowed by State or Federal laws and regulations. When the Contractor chooses to dispose of uncontaminated soil at a clean construction and demolition debris (CCDD) facility or at an uncontaminated soil fill operation, it shall be the Contractor's responsibility to have the pH of the material tested to ensure the value is between 6.25 and 9.0, inclusive. A copy of the pH test results shall be provided to the Engineer.

A permit shall be obtained from IEPA and made available to the Engineer prior to open burning of organic materials (i.e., plant refuse resulting from pruning or removal of trees or shrubs) or other construction or demolition debris. Organic materials originating within the right-of-way limits may be chipped or shredded and placed as mulch around landscape plantings within the right-of-way when approved by the Engineer. Chipped or shredded material to be placed as mulch shall not exceed a depth of 6 in. (150 mm)."

Effective: January 1, 2001 Revised: January 1, 201

All references to Sections or Articles in this specification hall be construed to mean specific Section or Article of the Standard Specifications for Social and Bridge Construction, adopted by the Department of Transportation.

Replace Article 102.01 of the Standard Specification, with the following:

<u>"Prequalification of Bidders</u>. When prequalification is required and the Awarding Authority for contract construction work is the County Buard of a County, the Council, the City Council, or the President and Board of Trustees of a city, village, or town, each prospective bidder, in evidence of competence, shall furnish the Awarding Authority as a prerequisite to the release of proposal forms by the Awarding Authority, a certified or photostatic copy of a "Certificate of Eligibility" issued by the Department of Transportation, according to the Department's "Prequalification Manual".

The two low blooms after the letting, a sworn affidavit in triplicate, showing all uncompleted contracts awarded to them and all low bids pending award for Federal, State, County, Municipal and private work, using the blank form made available for this affidavit. One copy shall be filed with the Awarding Authority and two copies with IDOT's District office.

<u>Issuance of Proposal Forms</u>. The Awarding Authority reserves the right to refuse to issue a proposal form for bidding purposes for any of the following reasons:

- (a) Lack of competency and adequate machinery, plant, and other equipment, as revealed by the financial statement and experience questionnaires required in the pregualification procedures.
- (b) Uncompleted work which, in the judgment of the Awarding Authority, might hinder or prevent the prompt completion of additional work awarded.
- (c) False information provided on a bidder's "Affidavit of Availability".
- (d) Failure to pay, or satisfactorily settle, all bills due for labor and material on former contracts in force at the time of issuance of proposal forms.
- (e) Failure to comply with any prequalification regulations of the Department.
- (f) Default under previous contracts.
- (g) Unsatisfactory performance record as shown by past work for the Awarding Authority, judged from the standpoint of workmanship and progress.
- (h) When the Contractor is suspended from eligibility to bid at a public letting where the contract is awarded by, or requires approval of, the Department.
- (i) When any agent, servant, or employee of the prospective bidder currently serves as a member, employee, or agent of a governmental body that is financially involved in the proposal work.

(j) When any agent, servant, or employee of the perspective bidder has participated in the preparation of plans or specifications for the proposed work.

Interpretation of Quantities in the Bid Schedule. The quantities appearing in the bid schedule are approximate and are prepared for the comparison of bids. Payment to the Contractor will be made only for the actual quantities of work performed and acceptor materials furnished according to the contract. The scheduled quantities of work to be done and materials to be furnished may be increased, decreased, or omitted as hereinafter provided

Examination of Plans, Specifications, Special Provision ite of Work. The bidder shall, before submitting a bid, carefully examine the provisions the contract. The bidder shall inspect in detail the site of the proposed work, investigate and scome familiar with all the local conditions affecting the contract and fully acquaint frem elves with the detailed requirements of construction. Submission of a bid shall be a conclusive assurance and warranty the bidder has nd all requirements for the performance of made these examinations and the bidder un the work. If his/her bid is accepted, the bidder shall be responsible for all errors in the proposal resulting from his/her failure or neglest to comply with these instructions. The Awarding Authority will, in no case, be responsible for any costs, expenses, losses, or change in failure or neglect of the bidder to make these anticipated profits resulting from suc examinations.

The bidder shall take no advantage of any error or omission in the proposal and advertised contract. Any prospective bids ar, who desires an explanation or interpretation of the plans, specification, or any of the contract documents, shall request such in writing from the Awarding Authority, in sufficient time to allow a written reply by the Awarding Authority that can reach all prospective bidders being the submission of their bids. Any reply given a prospective bidder concerning any on the contract documents, plans, and specifications will be furnished to all prospective bidders in the form determined by the Awarding Authority including, but not limited to, an addendum, if the information is deemed by the Awarding Authority to be necessary in submitting bids or if the Awarding Authority concludes the information would aid competition. Oral explanations, interpretations, or instructions given before the submission of bids unless at a prebid conference will not be binding on the Awarding Authority.

<u>Preparation of the Proposal</u>. Bidders shall submit their proposals on the form furnished by the Awarding Authority. The proposal shall be executed properly, and bids shall be made for all items indicated in the proposal form, except when alternate bids are asked, a bid on more than one alternate for each item is not required, unless otherwise provided. The bidder shall indicate in figures, a unit price for each of the separate items called for in the proposal form; the bidder shall show the products of the respective quantities and unit prices in the column provided for that purpose, and the gross sum shown in the place indicated in the proposal form shall be the summation of said products. All writing shall be with ink or typewriter, except the signature of the bidder which shall be written in ink.

If the proposal is made by an individual, that individual's name and business address shall be shown. If made by a firm or partnership, the name and business address of each member of the firm or partnership shall be shown. If made by a corporation, the proposal shall show the names, titles, and business addresses of the president, corporate secretary and treasurer. The proposal shall be signed by president or someone with authority to execute contracts and attested by the corporate secretary or someone with authority to execute or attest to the execution of contracts.

When prequalification is required, the proposal form shall be submitted by an authorized bidder in the same name and style as shown on the "Contractor's Statement of Experience and Financial Condition" used for prequalification.

Rejection of Proposals. The Awarding Authority reserves the right to reject any proposal for any of the conditions in "Issuance of Proposal Forms" or for any of the ron wing reasons:

- (a) More than one proposal for the same work from an individual tirm, partnership, or corporation under the same name or different names
- (b) Evidence of collusion among bidders.
- (c) Unbalanced proposals in which the bid prices for some items are, in the judgment of the Awarding Authority, out of proportion to the bid prices for other items.
- (d) If the proposal does not contain a unit price for each pay item listed, except in the case of authorized alternate pay items or lump sur pay items.
- (e) If the proposal form is other than that arm hed by the Awarding Authority; or if the form is altered or any part thereof is detached.
- (f) If there are omissions, erasures, Iterations, unauthorized additions, conditional or alternate bids, or irregularities of any kind which may tend to make the proposal incomplete, indefinite or ambigatus as to its meaning.
- (g) If the bidder adds any provisions eserving the right to accept or reject an award, or to enter into a contract range and to an award.
- (h) If the proposal is not accompanied by the proper proposal guaranty.
- (i) If the proposal is preserved with other than ink or typewriter, or otherwise fails to meet the requirements of the above "Preparation of Proposal" section.

<u>Proposal Guaranty</u>. Each proposal shall be accompanied by a bid bond on the Department form contained in the proposal, executed by a corporate surety company satisfactory to the Awarding Authority, by a bank cashier's check or a properly certified check for not less than five percent of the amount bid, or for the amount specified in the following schedule:

In the event that one proposal guaranty check is intended to cover two or more proposals, the amount must equal to the sum of the proposal guaranties which would be required for each individual proposal.

Bank cashier's checks or properly certified checks accompanying proposals shall be made payable to the County Treasurer, when a County is the Awarding A thority or the City, Village, or Town Treasurer, when a city, village, or town is the Awarding A thority.

The proposal guaranty checks of all, except the two lower tresponsible, will be returned promptly after the proposals have been checked, tabulated, and the relation of the proposals established. Proposal guaranty checks of the two lowest bidders will be returned as soon as the contract and contract bond of the successful bidders are been properly executed and approved. Bid bonds will not be returned.

After a period of three working days had elaps d after the date of opening proposals, the Awarding Authority may permit the two lowest bidders to substitute for the bank cashier's checks or certified checks submitted with their proposals as proposal guaranties, bid bonds on the Department forms executed by con prate surety companies satisfactory to the Awarding Authority.

Delivery of Proposals. If a special envelope is supplied by the Awarding Authority, each proposal should be submitted in that envelope furnished by the Awarding Authority and the blank spaces on the envelope shall be filled in correctly to clearly indicate its contents. When an envelope other than the special one furnished by the Awarding Authority is used, it shall be marked to clearly indicate its contents. When sent by mail, the sealed proposal shall be addressed to the Avarding Authority at the address and in care of the official in whose office the bids are to be received. All proposals shall be filed prior to the time and at the place specified in the Notice to Bidders. Proposals received after the time specified will be returned to the bidder unopened.

<u>Withdrawal of Proposals</u>. Permission will be given a bidder to withdraw a proposal if the bidder makes the request in writing or in person before the time for opening proposals.

<u>Public Opening of Proposals</u>. Proposals will be opened and read publicly at the time and place specified in the Notice to Bidders. Bidders, their authorized agents, and other interested parties are invited to be present.

<u>Consideration of Proposals</u>. After the proposals are opened and read, they will be compared on the basis of the summation of the products of the quantities shown in the bid schedule by the unit bid prices. In awarding contracts, the Awarding Authority will, in addition to considering the amounts stated in the proposals, take into consideration the responsibility of the various bidders as determined from a study of the data required under "Prequalification of Bidders", and from other investigations which it may elect to make.

The right is reserved to reject any or all proposals, to waive technicalities, or to advertise for new proposals, if in the judgment of the Awarding Authority, the best interests of the Awarding Authority will be promoted thereby.

<u>Award of Contract</u>. The award of contract will be made within 45 calendar days after the opening of proposals to the lowest responsible and qualified bidder whose proposal complies with all the requirements prescribed. The successful bidder will be notified by letter of intent that his/her bid has been accepted, and subject to the following conditions, the bidder will be the Contractor.

An approved contract executed by the Awarding Authority is required before the Awarding Authority is bound. An award may be cancelled any time by the Avarding Authority prior to execution in order to protect the public interest and integrity of the bioting process or for any other reason if, in the judgment of the Awarding Authority the test interests of the Awarding Authority will be promoted thereby.

If a contract is not awarded within 45 days after he opening of proposals, bidders may file a written request with the Awarding Authority for the windows of their bid, and the Awarding Authority will permit such withdrawal.

Requirement of Contract Bond. If the Avarding Authority requires a Contract Bond, the Contractor or Supplier shall furnish the Awarding Authority a performance and payment bond with good and sufficient sureties in the far amount of the award as the penal sum. The surety shall be acceptable to the Awarding Authority, shall waive notice of any changes and extensions of time, and shall submit its bord on the form furnished by the Awarding Authority.

<u>Execution of Contract.</u> The contract shall be executed by the successful bidder and returned, together with the Contract Bond, within 15 days after the contract has been mailed to the bidder.

If the bidder to whom the award is made is a corporation organized under the laws of a State other than like ois, the bidder shall furnish the Awarding Authority a copy of the corporation's Certificate of Authority to do business in the State of Illinois with the return of the executed contract and bond. Failure to furnish such evidence of a Certificate of Authority within the time required will be considered as just cause for the annulment of the award and the forfeiture of the proposal guaranty to the Awarding Authority, not as a penalty, but in payment of liquidated damages sustained as a result of such failure.

<u>Failure to Execute Contract</u>. If the contract is not executed by the Awarding Authority within 15 days following receipt from the bidder of the properly executed contracts and bonds, the bidder shall have the right to withdraw his/her bid without penalty.

Failure of the successful bidder to execute the contract and file acceptable bonds within 15 days after the contract has been mailed to the bidder shall be just cause for the cancellation of the award and the forfeiture of the proposal guaranty which shall become the property of the Awarding Authority, not as penalty, but in liquidation of damages sustained. Award may then be made to the next lowest responsible bidder, or the work may be readvertised and constructed under contract, or otherwise, as the Awarding Authority may decide."

Upon seven business days otice, the Contractor and each subcontractor shall make available for inspection and copying at a location within this State during reasonable hours, the payroll records to the public body in charge of the project, its officers and agents, the Director of Labor and his deputies and agents, and to federal, State, or local law enforcement agencies and prosecutors.
- 3. Submission of Payroll Records. The Contractor and each subcontractor shall, no later than the 15th day of each calendar month, file a certified payroll for the immediately preceding month with the public body in charge of the project, except that the full social security number and home address shall not be included on weekly transmittals. Instead the payrolls shall include an identification number for each employee (e.g., the last four digits of the employee's social security number). The certified payroll shall consist of a complete copy of the payroll records except starting and ending times of work each day may be omitted

The certified payroll shall be accompanied by a statement signed by the Contractor or subcontractor or an officer, employee, or agent of the contractor or subcontractor which avers that: (i) he or she has examined the certified payroll records required to be submitted by the Act and such records are true and accurate; (ii) the hourly rate paid to each worker is not less than the general prevailing rate of hourly wages required; and (iii) the Contractor or subcontractor is aware that filing a certified payroll that he or she knows to be false is a Class A misdemeanor.

4. Employees Interviews. The Contractor and each subcontractor shall permit his/her employees to be interviewed on the job, during working hours, by compliance investigators of the Department or the Department of Labor.

"(e) Procedure. All Claims shall be submitted to the Engineer. The Engineer will consider all information submitted with the claim. Claims not conforming to this Article with a returned without consideration. The Engineer may schedule a claim presentation meeting if, in the Engineer's judgement, such a meeting would air in resolution of the claim, otherwise a decision will be based on the claim documentation submitted. A final decision will be rendered within 90 days of receipt of the claim.

Full compliance by the Contractor with the provisions specified in this Article is a contractual condition precedent to the Contractor's right to seek relief in the Court of Claims. The Engineer's written decision shall be the final administrative action of the Department. Unless the Contractor files a claim for adjudication by the Court of Claims within 60 days after the date of the written decision, the failure to file shall constitute a release and waiver of the claim."

Bureau of Labor Statistics in its monthly publication of employment and unemployment figures, the Contractor shall employ at least 90 percent Illinois laborers. "Illinois laborers means any person who has resided in Illinois for at least 30 days and intends to become or remain an Illinois resident.

Other laborers may be used when Illinois laborers as defined herein are not available, or are incapable of performing the particular type of work involved, if so certified by the Contractor and approved by the Engineer. The Contractor may place no more than three of his regularly employed non-resident executive and technical experts, who do not qualify as Illinois laborers, to do work encompassed by this Contract during a period of excessive unemployment.

This provision applies to all labor, whether skilled, semi-skilled or unskilled, whether manual or non-manual.

Substance Abuse Prevention Program. Before the Contractor and any subcontractor commences work, the Contractor and any subcontractor shall have in place a written Substance Abuse Prevention Program for the prevention of substance abuse among its employees which maets or exceeds the requirements in 820 ILCS 265 or shall have a collective bargaining greement in effect dealing with the subject matter of 820 ILCS 265.

The Contractor and an subcontractor shall file with the public body engaged in the construction of the sublic works: a copy of the Substance Abuse Prevention Program along with a cover letter certifying that their program meets the requirements of the Act, or a letter certifying that the Contractor or a subcontractor has a collective bargaining agreement in effect dealing with the subject matter of this Act.

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Special Provisions

The following Special Provisions supplement the "Standard Specifications for Road and Bridge Construction", adopted January 1, 2012, (herein after referred to as the Standard Specifications); the latest edition of the "Illinois Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices for Streets and Highways"; and the Manual of Test Procedures for Materials" in effection the date of invitation for bids; and "Supplemental Specifications and Recurring Special Provisions" indicated on the Check Sheet included herein, which apply to and govern the Bove mentioned improvement, and in case of conflict with any part or parts of said specifications, the said Special Provisions shall take precedence and shall govern.

PREQUALIFICATIONS OF BIDDERS

Prequalification of bidders shall be required in accordance with LR 102.

LOCATION OF IMPROVEMENT

The location for this section is a Chemung Township, McHenry County, Illinois, on Graf Road and White Oaks Road with an improvement length of 3,900 feet.

DESCRIPTION OF WORK

The work consists of the construction of Base Preparation-Pulverization (Special), a 2.25" lift of Hot-Mix Asphalt Binder Course, IL 19.0, N50 along with necessary and related work as detailed in the Special Provisions and the Estimate of Quantities.

TRAFFIC

All roads shall remain open to traffic. The Contractor shall obtain, erect, maintain and remove all signs, barricades, flagmen and other traffic control devices as may be necessary for the regulating, warning or guiding of traffic. Placement and maintenance of traffic control devices shall be as directed by the Engineer and in accordance with the applicable parts of Article 107.14 of the Standard Specifications. All traffic control shall be considered incidental to the contract.

TRAFFIC CONTROL PLAN

The Engineer shall be responsible for administration of the Traffic Court Plan.

Access to abutting properties shall be maintained at all times.

Traffic Control shall be according to the applicable section of the Standard Specifications, the Supplemental Specifications, the "Illinois Manual on Uniternal Traffic Control Devices for Streets and Highways", any special details and Highway Standards contained in the plans and the Special Provisions contained herein.

Special attention is called to Article 107.9 and the applicable parts of Section 701 and 703 of the Standard Specifications and the following Highway Standards, Supplemental Specifications and Recurring Special Provisions or other Special Provisions relating to traffic control.

Highway Standards: 701306, 731011, 701301, 701311, 701901, BLR-24

For projects that shall exceed four (4) days duration, all signs except those referring to daily lane closures shall be post-mounted in accordance with Highway Standard 701901.

The Contractor sharms that all traffic control devices installed by the contractor are in place and operational every lay, including Sundays, holidays and under all weather conditions.

The Contractor shall obtain, erect, maintain and remove any and all signs, barricades, flaggers and other traffic control devices as may be necessary for the purpose of regulating, warning and guiding traffic. No contractor personnel or equipment shall be allowed onto the road surface or shoulders unless flaggers and traffic control devices are in place. Placement and maintenance of all traffic control devices shall be in accordance with the applicable Highway Standards and as directed by the Engineer.

All traffic control and traffic control devices shall be considered incidental and will not be measured for payment.

GENERAL AREA CLEANUP

The Contractor shall be responsible for disposing all surplus materials or construction debris related to the job. The Contractor shall also be responsible for any refuse that was discarded by the crews during the paving project.

HIGHWAY STANDARDS

Any reference to Highway Standards shall be assumed to mean the most recent revision in effect at the time of letting.

UTILITIES

The Contractor shall take any necessary precautions to protect the property of the various public and/or private utilities which may be located underground or above ground at or adjacent to the sites of this improvement(s). It shall be the Contractor's responsibility of determine from the respective utility companies the actual location of their facilities and to make arrangements to have the utility companies remove or relocate any facilities that way interfere with this improvement(s) prior to starting the work.

BASE PREPARATION - PULVEN ZATION (SPECIAL)

Before work begins all Traffic Control devices an signage shall be installed to the satisfaction of the Engineer. During the work, one lane of the road will remain open to traffic at all times. This work shall consist of pulverizing, to a nominal combined thickness of eight (8") inches of existing bituminous road surface and aggregate base, and relaying of the pulverized material onto the roadbed. The actual depth to be pulve ized can vary depending on the existing conditions in the field or as directed by the Engineer.

The existing asphalt shall be purverized to the specified depth and 100 percent of the pulverized material shall pass a 1-½' screen. Depending on the depth of the existing bituminous materials, the existing aggregate base may also be pulverized and mixed with the asphalt material during the pulverization appropriately after pulverizing, the lay down of the material shall be accomplished using a paver, grader, or a combination as necessary to achieve the proper profile and crown as directed by the Engineer.

The contractor shall be capable of adding sufficient water to achieve the required compaction. The re-laid material shall be immediately compacted in the following sequence: First with a vibratory pads foot roller and second with a vibratory steel drum roller. Water shall be added prior to and during compaction as required. The surface shall be rolled to the degree that there will be no appreciable displacement of material either laterally or longitudinally under the compacting equipment.

The lift thickness and compaction equipment shall be as follows: For an in-place depth of material to be pulverized, a minimum of 25,000 lb. pads foot vibratory roller and a minimum of 25,000 lb. steel drum vibratory roller shall be used.

At the completion of each working day, where the pulverized and re-laid asphalt pavement surfaces abut there shall not be a difference in elevation of over one (1) inch either longitudinally or transversely. When the difference is greater than one (1) inch a ramp shall be placed until work on the project continues.

The existing asphalt surface, to the limits of the mailbox turnouts and driveway approaches, shall be removed and the asphalt material shall be placed on the mainline road to be incorporated into

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the pulverizing operation on the mainline road. The mailbox turnouts and driveway approaches shall be pulverized to the limits determined by the engineer to whatever width dimension is necessary to create and maintain a satisfactory riding condition. After the pulverizing of the road, the pulverized material shall be placed back onto the driveway approaches and mail box turnouts and compacted during the compaction of the mainline road.

A proof roll is required before proceeding with any HMA pawing. The proof roll shall be performed in the presence of the engineer. The proof roll shall be performed with a fully loaded tandem three axle dump truck. The entire road shall be pixer rolled. Any deflection of more than one half (1/2) inch in the newly pulverized road shall be considered unacceptable. The proof roll shall not be paid for separately, but shall be considered incidental to this pay item.

The subgrade shall be firm and able to sup ort construction equipment without displacement. Additional drying and/or compaction of the pulverized material shall be accomplished as needed. Soft or yielding subgrade shall be corrected and made stable before construction proceeds. Excess material will be removed and disposed of by the Contractor and the base shall be brought to a smooth grade and proper crown. Removal of excess material shall be considered incidental to this pay item.

Unstable and/or unsuitable material shall be removed and replaced with CA-6 aggregate and geotechnical fabric for and stabilization as directed by the engineer. The contractor shall not excavate below a depth of twelve (12") inches without approval of the engineer. The quantities listed on the Schedur of Prices sheet for these items are estimated for bidding purposes and may increase or decrease based upon field conditions and no adjustment in unit price will be made.

Method of Measurement. This work will be measured for payment as follows.

(a) Measured Quantities. Prior to work beginning Base Preparation – Pulverization (Special) will be measured for payment based upon the dimensions of the existing pavement that is to be removed. Base Preparation - Pulverization (Special) will be measured for payment in place and the area computed in square yards.

The volume of unstable or unsuitable material removed will be measured for payment in cubic yards and associated aggregate replacement will be measured for payment in tons of material placed.

Geotechnical fabric shall be installed in accordance with the applicable parts of Article 210 of the Standard Specifications. Geotechnical Fabric shall be measured for payment in place and the area computed in square yards.

(b) Adjustment of Quantities. The quantity of Base Preparation - Pulverization (Special) will be adjusted if the pulverized thickness varies more than 15 percent from the thickness specified. The quantity will be either increased or decreased according to

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the table listed in Article 440.07 (c) of the Standard Specification. Any variation in thickness shall be as directed and approved by the Engineer.

Basis of Payment. This work will be paid at the contract unit price per square yard for BASE PREPARATION—PULVERIZATION (SPECIAL), which price shall include pulverization of base, watering, relaying of material, shaping, compacting and removal of excess material; at the contract unit price per cubic yard for REMOVAL AND DISPOSAL OF UNSUITABLE MATERIAL; at the contract unit price per ton for AGGREGOTE SASE REPAIR and at the contract unit price per square yard for GEOTECHNEAL FABRIC FOR GROUND STABILIZATION.

DRIVEWAYS & ENTRANCES

Entrances shall be constructed to whatever width and length dimensions are necessary to create and maintain a satisfactory riding condition with approval of the Engineer.

MAILBOX TURNOUTS

Mailbox turnouts shall be payd in accordance with Standard BLR 24 or to a dimension conforming to existing condition.

EQUIPATION FOR WEIGHING BITUMINOUS MIXTURES

Contractors shall comply with Article 1102.01(a)(9) of the Standard Specifications. Contractors will not be compensated for any bituminous mixtures which are not weighed in accordance with Article 1102.01(a)(9) of the Standard Specifications and utilized on the project.

QUALITY CONTROL/QUALITY ASSURANCE

This is a Quality Control/Quality Assurance (QC/QA) project in accordance with Article 1030 of the Standard Specifications. Per the Standard Specifications, the Contractor shall submit, in writing to the Engineer, a proposed QC plan for the project for approval before construction. The Contractor shall notify both the Engineer and McHenry County's material testing agency 48 hours prior to any paving operations. The Contractor shall also notify the IDOT Bureau of Materials at (847) 705-4337 48 hours prior to any paving operations to set up required plant inspection. Calls must be placed prior to closing at 4:15 pm Monday through Friday.

PAVING OPERATIONS

The Contractor shall, at all times, provide a minimum five (5) man crew for all paving operations. The five man crew will consist of a dump man, paver operator, two back screed operators and at least one lute man. The Contractor shall, when reeded lute the center seam between the two new layers of bituminous mix.

PAVING EQUIPME T

Paving operations shall be conducted using a track and a All other applicable parts of Article 1102.03 of the Standard Specifications shall still apply.

BITUMINOUS MATERIALS (PRIME COAT)

This work shall be performed in accordance with the applicable parts of Article 406 of the Standard Specifications. The bituminous material for prime coat between the pulverized base and HMA layer shall be MC-3. Application rate for MC-30 shall be 0.25 gallons per square yard unless specified otherwise by the Engineer. The bituminous material for prime coat between HMA layers shall be SN-1. Application rate for SS-1 shall be 0.08 gallons per square yard unless specified otherwise by the Engineer. The contractor shall place signs in accordance with Article 701.17(c)(1) of the Standard Specifications.

AGGREGATE (PRIME COAT)

This work shall be performed in accordance with the applicable parts of Article 406.05(b) of the Standard Specifications. Method of measurement shall be by the ton and in accordance with the applicable parts of Article 406. The application rate shall be 3 pounds per square yard unless specified otherwise by the Engineer.

FINE AGGREGATE FOR HOT- MIX ASPHALT (HMA) (D-1)

Effective: May 1, 2007 Revised: January 1, 2012

Revise Article 1003.03 (c) of the Standard Specifications to red:

"(c) Gradation. The fine aggregate gradation for all IMA shall be FA1, FA 2, FA 20, FA 21 or FA 22. When Reclaimed Asphalt Pavement (RAF) is incorporated in the HMA design, the use of FA 21 Gradation will not be remitted

RECLAIMED ASPHALT PAVEMENT AND RECLAIMED ASPHALT SHINGLES (D-1)

Effective: November 1, 2012 Revise: November 1, 2013

Revise Section 1031 of the Standard Specifications to read:

"SECTION 1031. RECLAIMED ASPHALT PAVEMENT AND RECLAIMED ASPHALT SHINGLES

1031.01 Description. Reclaimed asphalt paterning and reclaimed asphalt shingles shall be according to the following.

- (a) Reclaimed Asphalt Pavement (RAP): RAP is the material resulting from cold milling or crushing an existing hot-mix a phalt (HMA) pavement. RAP will be considered processed FRAP after completion of both crushing and screening to size. The Contractor shall supply written documentation that the RAP originated from routes or airfields under federal, state, or local agency jurisdiction.
- (b) Reclaimed Asphalt Shintles (RAS). Reclaimed asphalt shingles (RAS). RAS is from the processing and printing of preconsumer or post-consumer shingles. RAS shall be a clean and unifor material with a maximum of 0.5 percent unacceptable material, as defined in a great of Materials and Physical Research Policy Memorandum "Reclaimed Asphalt Shingle (RAS) Sources", by weight of RAS. All RAS used shall come from a Bureau of Materials and Physical Research approved processing facility where it shall be ground and processed to 100 percent passing the 3/8 in. (9.5 mm) sieve and 90 percent passing the #4 (4.75 mm) sieve. RAS shall meet the testing requirements specified herein. In addition, RAS shall meet the following Type 1 or Type 2 requirements.
 - (1) Type 1. Type 1 RAS shall be processed, preconsumer asphalt shingles salvaged from the manufacture of residential asphalt roofing shingles.
 - (2) Type 2. Type 2 RAS shall be processed post-consumer shingles only, salvaged from residential, or four unit or less dwellings not subject to the National Emission Standards for Hazardous Air Pollutants (NESHAP).

1031.02 Stockpiles. RAP and RAS stockpiles shall be according to the following.

(a) RAP Stockpiles. The Contractor shall construct individual, sealed RAP stockpiles meeting one of the following definitions. Additional processed RAP (FRAP) shall be stockpiled in a separate working pile, as designated in the QC Plan, and only added to the sealed stockpile when test results for the working pile are complete and are found to meet tolerances specified herein for the original sealed FRAP stockpile. Stockpiles shall be sufficiently separated to prevent intermingling at the base. All stockpiles (including unprocessed RAP and FRAP) shall be identified by signs indicating the type as listed below (i.e. "Non- Quality, FRAP -#4 or Type 2 RAS", etc...).

- (1) Fractionated RAP (FRAP). FRAP shall consist of RAP from Class I, Superpave HMA (High and Low ESAL) or equivalent mixtures. The case aggregate in FRAP shall be crushed aggregate and may represent nore may one aggregate type and/or quality but shall be at least C quality. All FRAP's all be processed prior to testing and sized into fractions with the separation occurring on or between the #4 (4.75 mm) and 1/2 in. (12.5 mm) sieves. As glomerations shall be minimized such that 100 percent of the RAP in the coarse faction shall pass the maximum sieve size specified for the mix the FRAP will be used.
- (2) Restricted FRAP (B quality) stockplies shall consist of RAP from Class I, Superpave (High ESAL), or HMA (High ESAL). It approved by the Engineer, the aggregate from a maximum 3.0 inch single co thined pass of surface/binder milling will be classified as B quality. All millings from this application will be processed into FRAP as described previously.
- (3) Conglomerate Conglomerate RAP stockpiles shall consist of RAP from Class I, Superpave HMA (High and Low ESAL) or equivalent mixtures. The coarse aggregate in the RAP shall be crushed aggregate and may represent more than one aggregate two and/or quality but shall be at least C quality. This RAP may have an inconsistent gradation and/or asphalt binder content prior to processing. All conglomerate RAP shall be processed (FRAP) prior to testing. Conglomerate RAP stockpiles shall not contain steel slag or other expansive material as determined by the Department.
- (4) Conglomerate "D" Quality (DQ). Conglomerate DQ RAP stockpiles shall consist of RAP from HMA shoulders, bituminous stabilized subbases or Superpave (Low ESAL)/HMA (Low ESAL) IL-19.0L binder mixture. The coarse aggregate in this RAP may be crushed or round but shall be at least D quality. This RAP may have an inconsistent gradation and/or asphalt binder content. Conglomerate DQ RAP stockpiles shall not contain steel slag or other expansive material as determined by the Department.
- (5) Non-Quality. RAP stockpiles that do not meet the requirements of the stockpile categories listed above shall be classified as "Non-Quality".
- RAP or FRAP containing contaminants, such as earth, brick, sand, concrete, sheet asphalt, bituminous surface treatment (i.e. chip seal), pavement fabric, joint sealants, plant cleanout etc., will be unacceptable unless the contaminants are removed to the satisfaction of the Engineer. Sheet asphalt shall be stockpiled separately.
- (b) RAS Stockpiles. Type 1 and Type 2 RAS shall be stockpiled separately and shall be sufficiently separated to prevent intermingling at the base. Each stockpile shall be signed indicating what type of RAS is present.

However, a RAS source may submit a written request to the Department for approval to blend mechanically a specified ratio of type 1 RAS with type 2 RAS. The source will not be permitted to change the ratio of the blend without the Department prior written approval. The Engineer's written approval will be required to neglanically blend RAS with any fine aggregate produced under the AGCS, up to an equal weight of RAS, to improve workability. The fine aggregate shall be "B Quality or better from an approved Aggregate Gradation Control System source. The fine aggregate shall be one that is approved for use in the HMA mixture and accounted for in the mix design and during HMA production.

Records identifying the shingle processing active supplying the RAS, RAS type and lot number shall be maintained by project con ract number and kept for a minimum of three years.

1031.03 Testing. FRAP and RAS testing shall be according to the following.

- (a) FRAP Testing. When set in HMA, the FRAP shall be sampled and tested either during processing or after stockpilin. It shall also be sampled during HMA production.
 - (1) During St ckpiling. For testing during stockpiling, washed extraction samples shall be the at the minimum frequency of one sample per 500 tons (459 metric tons) for the first 2000 tons (1800 metric tons) and one sample per 2006 tons (1800 metric tons) thereafter. A minimum of five tests shall be required for stockpiles less than 4000 tons (3600 metric tons).
 - (2) Incoming Material. For testing as incoming material, washed extraction samples shall be run at a minimum frequency of one sample per 2000 tons (1800 metric tons) or once per week, whichever comes first.
 - (3) After Stockpiling. For testing after stockpiling, the Contractor shall submit a plan for approval to the District proposing a satisfactory method of sampling and testing the RAP/FRAP pile either in-situ or by restockpiling. The sampling plan shall meet the minimum frequency required above and detail the procedure used to obtain representative samples throughout the pile for testing.

Before extraction, each field sample of FRAP, shall be split to obtain two samples of test sample size. One of the two test samples from the final split shall be labeled and stored for Department use. The Contractor shall extract the other test sample according to Department procedure. The Engineer reserves the right to test any sample (split or Department-taken) to verify Contractor test results.

(b) RAS Testing. RAS shall be sampled and tested during stockpiling according to Bureau of Materials and Physical Research Policy Memorandum, "Reclaimed Asphalt Shingle (RAS) Sources". The Contractor shall also sample as incoming material at the HMA plant.

- (1) During Stockpiling. Washed extraction and testing for unacceptable materials shall be run at the minimum frequency of oue sample per 200 tons (180 metric tons) for the first 1000 tons (900 metric tons) and one sample per 1000 tons (900 metric tons) thereafter. A minimum of the samples are required for stockpiles less than 1000 tons (900 metric tons). Once a ≤ 1000 ton (900 metric ton), five-sample/test stockpile has been established it shall be sealed. Additional incoming RAS shall be in a separate working pile as designated in the Quality Control plant and only added to the sealed stockpile when the test results of the working pile are complete and are found to meet the tolerances specified herein for the only added RAS stockpile.
- (2) Incoming Material. For testing as incoming material at the HMA plant, washed extraction shall be run at the minimum frequency of one sample per 250 tons (227 metric tons). A nation of five samples are required for stockpiles less than 1000 tons (900 metric tons). The incoming material test results shall meet the tolerances specified herein.

The Contractor shall obtain and make available all test results from start of the initial stockpile sample, and ested at the shingle processing facility in accordance with the facility's QC Plan

Before extraction, each field sample shall be split to obtain two samples of test sample size. One of the two test samples from the final split shall be labeled and stored for Department u.e. The Contractor shall extract the other test sample according to Department procedures. The Engineer reserves the right to test any sample (split or Department-taken) to verify Contractor test results.

1031.04 Evaluation of Tests. Evaluation of tests results shall be according to the following.

(a) Evaluation of FRAP Test Results. All test results shall be compiled to include asphalt binder content, gradation and, when applicable (for slag), G_{mm}. A five test average of results from the original pile will be used in the mix designs. Individual extraction test results run thereafter, shall be compared to the average used for the mix design, and will be accepted if within the tolerances listed below.

If any individual sieve and/or asphalt binder content tests are out of the above tolerances when compared to the average used for the mix design, we FRAP stockpile shall not be used in Hot-Mix Asphalt unless the FRAP representing those tests is removed from the stockpile. All test data and acceptance range schall be sent to the District for evaluation.

The Contractor shall maintain a representative moving average of five tests to be used for Hot-Mix Asphalt production.

With the approval of the Enginee, the ignition oven may be substituted for extractions according to the Illinois Test Procedure, "Calibration of the Ignition Oven for the Purpose of Characterizing Reclaim d Asphalt Pavement (RAP)" or Illinois Modified AASHTO T-164-11, Test Method A

(b) Evaluation of RAL Test Results. All of the test results, with the exception of percent unacceptable in stellars shall be compiled and averaged for asphalt binder content and gradation. A five it st average of results from the original pile will be used in the mix designs. Including test results run thereafter, when compared to the average used for the mix designs will be accepted if within the tolerances listed below.

If any individual sieve and/or asphalt binder content tests are out of the above tolerances when compared to the average used for the mix design, the RAS shall not be used in Hot-Mix Asphalt unless the RAS representing those tests is removed from the stockpile. All test data and acceptance ranges shall be sent to the District for evaluation.

(c) Quality Assurance by the Engineer. The Engineer may witness the sampling and splitting conduct assurance tests on split samples taken by the Contractor for quality control testing a minimum of once a month.

The overall testing frequency will be performed over the entire range of Contractor samples for asphalt binder content and gradation. The Engineer may select any or all split samples for assurance testing. The test results will be made available to the Contractor as soon as they become available.

The Engineer will notify the Contractor of observed deficiencies

Differences between the Contractor's and the Engineer's spin sample test results will be considered acceptable if within the following limits.

(d) Acceptance by the Engineer. Acceptable of the material will be based on the validation of the Contractor's quality control by the assurance process.

1031.05 Quality Designation of Aggregate in RAP and FRAP.

- (a) RAP. The aggregate quality of the RAP for homogenous, conglomerate, and conglomerate "D" quality stockpiles shall be set by the lowest quality of coarse aggregate in the RAP stockpile and are designated as follows.
 - (1) RAP from Class I, Superpave/HMA (High ESAL), or (Low ESAL) IL-9.5L surface mixtures are designated as containing Class B quality coarse aggregate.
 - (2) RAP from Superpave/HMA (Low ESAL) IL-19.0L binder mixture is designated as Class D quality coarse aggregate.
 - (3) RAP from Class I, Superpave/HMA (High ESAL) binder mixtures, bituminous base course mixtures, and bituminous base course widening mixtures are designated as containing Class C quality coarse aggregate.
 - (4) RAP from bituminous stabilized subbase and BAM shoulders are designated as containing Class D quality coarse aggregate.

(b) FRAP. If the Engineer has documentation of the quality of the FRAP aggregate, the Contractor shall use the assigned quality provided by the Engineer.

Fractionated RAP If the quality is not known, the quality shall be determined as for areg. stockpiles containing plus #4 (4.75 mm) sieve coarse shall have a maximum tonnage of 5,000 tons (4,500 metric tons). 1031.06 Use of FRAP and/or RAS in HMA. The use of FRAP and/or RAS shall be a Contractor's option when constructing HMA in all contracts.

- (a) FRAP. The use of RAP in HMA shall be as follows.
 - (1) Coarse x ogregate Size (after extraction). The coarse aggregate in all FRAP shall be equal to of less than the nominal maximum size requirement for the HMA mixture to be produced.
 - (2) Steel Slag Stockpiles. FRAP stockpiles containing steel slag or other expansive material, as determined by the Department, shall be homogeneous and will be approved for use in HMA (High ESAL and Low ESAL) mixtures regardless of lift or mix type.
 - (3) Use in HMA Surface Mixtures (High and Low ESAL). FRAP stockpiles for use in HMA surface mixtures (High and Low ESAL) shall have coarse aggregate that is Class B quality or better. FRAP shall be considered equivalent to limestone for frictional considerations unless produced/screened to minus 3/8 inch.
 - (4) Use in HMA Binder Mixtures (High and Low ESAL), HMA Base Course, and HMA Base Course Widening. FRAP stockpiles for use in HMA binder mixtures (High and Low ESAL), HMA base course, and HMA base course widening shall be FRAP in which the coarse aggregate is Class C quality or better.
 - (5) Use in Shoulders and Subbase. FRAP stockpiles for use in HMA shoulders and stabilized subbase (HMA) shall be FRAP, Restricted FRAP, conglomerate, or conglomerate DQ.

- (b) RAS. RAS meeting Type 1 or Type 2 requirements will be permitted in all HMA applications as specified herein.
- (c) FRAP and/or RAS Usage Limits. Type 1 or Type 2 RAS may be used alone or in conjunction with FRAP in HMA mixtures up to a maximum or 5.0% by weight of the total mix.

When FRAP, RAS or FRAP in conjunction with RAS s used, the percent of virgin asphalt binder replacement (ABR) shall not exceed the amounts indicated in the table below for a given N Design.

1031.07 HMA Mix Designs. At the Contractor's option, HMA mixtures may be constructed utilizing RAP/FRAP and/or RAS material meeting the detailed requirements specified herein.

- (a) FRAP and/or RAS. FRAP and /or RAS mix designs shall be submitted for verification. If additional FRAP or RAS stockpiles are tested and found to be lithin tolerance, as defined under "Evaluation of Tests" herein, and meet all requirements herein, the additional FRAP or RAS stockpiles may be used in the original design at the percent previously verified.
- (b) RAS. Type 1 and Type 2 RAS are not interest ageable in a mix design. A RAS stone bulk specific gravity (Gsb) of 2.500 shall be used or mix design purposes.

1031.08 HMA Production. HMA production utilizing FRAP and/or RAS shall be as follows.

To remove or reduce agglomerated material, a scalping screen, gator, crushing unit, or comparable sizing device approved by the Engineer shall be used in the RAS and FRAP feed system to remove or reduce oversized material. If material passing the sizing device adversely affects the mix production or quarky of the mix, the sizing device shall be set at a size specified by the Engineer.

If during mix production, corrective actions fail to maintain FRAP, RAS or QC/QA test results within control tolerance; of the equirements listed herein the Contractor shall cease production of the mixture containing FRAP or RAS and conduct an investigation that may require a new mix design.

- (a) RAS. RAS shall be incorporated into the HMA mixture either by a separate weight depletion system or by using the RAP weigh belt. Either feed system shall be interlocked with the aggregate feed or weigh system to maintain correct proportions for all rates of production and batch sizes. The portion of RAS shall be controlled accurately to within ± 0.5 percent of the amount of RAS utilized. When using the weight depletion system, flow indicators or sensing devices shall be provided and interlocked with the plant controls such that the mixture production is halted when RAS flow is interrupted.
- (b) HMA Plant Requirements. HMA plants utilizing FRAP and/or RAS shall be capable of automatically recording and printing the following information.
 - (1) Dryer Drum Plants.
 - a. Date, month, year, and time to the nearest minute for each print.
 - b. HMA mix number assigned by the Department.
 - c. Accumulated weight of dry aggregate (combined or individual) in tons (metric tons) to the nearest 0.1 ton (0.1 metric ton).

- d. Accumulated dry weight of RAS and FRAP in tons (metric tons) to the nearest 0.1 ton (0.1 metric ton).
- e. Accumulated mineral filler in revolutions, tons (me ric tons) etc. to the nearest 0.1 unit.
- f. Accumulated asphalt binder in gallons (liters, tors (metric tons), etc. to the nearest 0.1 unit.
- g. Residual asphalt binder in the RAS at FRAP material as a percent of the total mix to the nearest 0.1 percent.
- h. Aggregate RAS and FRAP resistur compensators in percent as set on the control panel. (Required when accumulated or individual aggregate and RAS and FRAP are printed in wit condition.)
- i. When producing in tures with FRAP and/or RAS, a positive dust control system shall be utilized.
- j. Accumula ed mix ure tonnage.
- k. Drot Rem ved (accumulated to the nearest 0.1 ton)

(2) Batch Plan

- a. Date, month, year, and time to the nearest minute for each print.
- b. HMA mix number assigned by the Department.
- c. Individual virgin aggregate hot bin batch weights to the nearest pound (kilogram).
- d. Mineral filler weight to the nearest pound (kilogram).
- f. RAS and FRAP weight to the nearest pound (kilogram).
- g. Virgin asphalt binder weight to the nearest pound (kilogram).
- h. Residual asphalt binder in the RAS and FRAP material as a percent of the total mix to the nearest 0.1 percent.

The printouts shall be maintained in a file at the plant for a minimum of one year or as directed by the Engineer and shall be made available upon request. The printing system will be inspected by the Engineer prior to production and verified at the beginning of each construction season thereafter.

1031.09 RAP in Aggregate Surface Course and Aggregate Shoulders. The use of RAP or FRAP in aggregate surface course and aggregate shoulders shall be as follows.

- (a) Stockpiles and Testing. RAP stockpiles may be any of thos dist of in Article 1031.02, except "Non-Quality" and "FRAP". The testing requirements of Article 1031.03 shall not apply. RAP used to construct aggregate surface course and a gregate shoulders shall be according to the current Bureau of Materials and Physical Research's Policy Memorandum, "Reclaimed Asphalt Pavement (RAP) or Aggregate Applications"
- (b) Gradation. One hundred percent of the RAP caterial shall pass the 1 1/2 in. (37.5mm) sieve. The RAP material shall be reasonably yell graded from coarse to fine. RAP material that is gap-graded, FRAP, or single size will not be accepted for use as Aggregate Surface Course and Aggregate a hot ders."
