HTE APPLICATIONS-

- ❖ Field Reporting installation and training took place the November 29th through December 2nd. There were a number of issues discovered during both phases last week, however HTE has worked diligently to provide solutions. The biggest hurdle was working around the Multi-Agency issue we seem to encounter with most installs. The training turned out to be more of a workshop. I plan to get everyone together again for a day to go over everything from start to CRIMES. One agency was able to leave a laptop, and we were able to get the necessary "fixes" on that machine. They were able to test from getting the dispatch in MDB, to FR, to the report going to CRIMES. We are currently waiting on final word from HTE regarding Mapping Updates. Our goal is to provide one CD that will provide all the current and necessary updates.
- ❖ Next week, Tuesday, all of the current records that are in Crimes will be removed for those agencies NOT live on Crimes. Any information that is entered after Tuesday will remain as a permanent record so anything entered should be from actual data. During the process of removing data the AS400 will be down. Down time should be minimal and everyone will be notified when it is back up.
