that the survey is taking place. Permission to enter property for photographs and close

inspection must be sought from the property owners.

The site should be checked with reference to the 1872 McHenry County Plat map. Several

of the features of the map were pointed out, including farms/owners, churches, schools,

cheese factories, and post offices.

Any note of witness trees should also be made, since we have records of several witness

trees, but no one has gone out to actually located then and verify if they are still standing.

Basic data sheets with (a) photograph(s) were produced during the 1986 survey. Members

were acquainted with the forms used. These be brought with for the current survey and

further details should be added, say, for example, the style of the structures encountered. It

should be remembered that a site may have more than one structure that is historically

significant, such as a house, shed, silo, and barn for example.

The members should take the data that they have gathered and enter these into an Excel

spreadsheet, with one line per field sheet (structure). The data will then be combined into

one large spreadsheet.

<u>Call to Order:</u> Bruce Randall began the meeting at approximately 1:07 p.m.

Workshop Activities

Gail Brown facilitated the workshop session with a continuation of the discussion from October and explained further the procedures in conducting a survey.

Gloria Mack presented a list of non-residential cultural features that were on the 1872 Plat Map book. The items were reviewed and discussed briefly. Hebron (Village) was noted as being called "Meade Station."

Bruce Randall and Trisha Doornbosch numbered the sites that had been called out in the 1986 windshield survey; although Ms. Doornbosch noted that it was difficult to differentiate between some sites that were close to some other possible sites. The sites found are being entered into an Excel spreadsheet. Mr. Randall will email the spreadsheet to the other commissioners and to staff.

Nick Chirikos volunteered to work on the Witness Tree monuments. Gail will provide a map of documented Hebron Township witness trees. In the meantime, a witness tree map of Alden Township was used to explain the process of checking for the existence (or lack of) the witness trees. The trees near a road should be sought out first, documented and photographed.

Sean Foley handed out photocopied illustrations of notable properties and a table of residences that were in the 1872 McHenry County Plat map book.

Mr. Chirikos asked for a quick run-down of the overall process (since he was unable to attend the October workshop committee meeting). The process was discussed briefly, being essentially the same as described in the October workshop summary. Some further procedural refinements were additionally discussed. Pictures from the 1986 survey will be clipped to one sheet per site prior to going out into the field. Pictures should be taken of every structure that may be historically relevant. Notes should be added to the field sheet. Mr. Chirikos and Mrs. Gray asked if it were possible to have electronic-format field sheets. Ms. Brown explained that it should be possible, but that it would probably be better to just scribble the observations on a field sheet and enter relevant information later. In this way more notes can be recorded and irrelevant information can be omitted at data-entry time. The addresses and PINs should be entered after visiting the site in the field.

Ms. Doornbosch and Ms. Mack will pre-fill field sheets and clip the related photographs to each sheet. Others can then pick these up at the Planning department and take them out into the field. Each person should enter their field notes into an Excel spreadsheet and then return the sheets and photos to the Planning department. The Excel spreadsheets can then be ported over to an Access database file. Ms. Brown explained that the Commission had purchased a license for Access a few years ago. Sean Foley will check into this and have it installed on a County computer if needed.

The survey team would like to have some space reserved in the Planning department in order to lay out the survey materials, including the 1986 photos, blank field sheets, completed field sheets, paper clips, and miscellaneous supplies. Ms. Brown also noted that the vertical file cabinets were full and more file space would be needed to store the completed survey materials. Sean will seek authorization for this.

The next workshop meeting date has not been set at this time.
